Research Methodology


In May 2017 we launched a US-wide online survey to understand perceptions on regulations surrounding the internet.

The survey was implemented by Morar Consulting, global marketing research specialists.

- Online survey fieldwork carried out between May 19 –
 June 2
- A national sample of 2,568 US residents aged 18+.
- Quotas were setup to ensure robust sample sizes from key states of interest: Montana (n=300), Hawaii (n=500), Florida (n=500), North Dakota (n=300) and all other US states (n=1,000).
- 12-minute online survey hosted by Morar Consulting's proprietary online research platform

^{*}Results of any sample are subject to sampling variation. The magnitude of the variation is measurable and is affected by the number of interviews and the level of the percentages expressing the results. In this particular study, the chances are 95 in 100 that a survey result does not vary, plus or minus, by more than 1.9 % percentage points from the result that would be obtained if interviews had been conducted with all persons in the universe represented by the sample.











Profile: Title II rules did nothing to keep companies like Google and Facebook from collecting data that shows what their sites' users browse and what apps they use.


















